At this conference we explore philology as a tool of religious encounter. 'Scriptural readings' and 'scriptural reasonings' are philological practices that establish meaning through a variety of grammatical, lexical, and historical exegetical techniques, and the modes of rational argument—reasoning—saturated with these practices.

The premise of this conference is that philological practices, as essentially comparative, inform complicated identities, and are an important tool of religious differentiation. Embedded in philological practices we find shared origins, methods, and values that cross religious divides.

The conference is organized in collaboration with the NYUAD Humanities Research Fellowship for the Study of the Arab World and the ERC Synergy Project 'The European Qur'an. Islamic Scripture in European Religion and Culture, 1150-1850'.
