- Facilitating exchanges among scholars and experts in history, architecture, art, and Islamic culture.

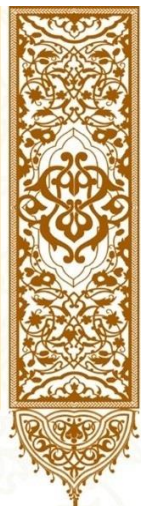
Conference Themes:
